



2024 NMAA State 1A-3A Track & Field Championships

Class 3A

Boys

St. Michael's took home the blue trophy for the fifth consecutive time as the Horsemen won the Class 3A team title at the 2024 NMAA State Track and Field Championships. St. Michael's finished first with 73.5 points. Robertson was second with 66.5 points and Socorro was third with 63. Socorro's Braden Mounyo was the high point individual with 28.5 points and victories in the 110m hurdles (14.89), record time in the 300m hurdles (38.10), triple jump (43'8"), and anchored their win in the 4x400m relay (3:29.69)



Robertson junior Aaron Doss swept the sprints

with victories in the 100m dash (11.28), 200m dash (22.17), and 400m dash (49.71).

Other winners include: Tohatchi senior Jared Peterson in the 800m run (1:57.70), Cottonwood Classical junior Shane Yara in the 1600m run (4:35.61), St. Michael's senior Landen Sandoval in the 3200m run (9:59.15), NMMI junior Sawyer Hull in the high jump (6'2") and javelin (157'), Socorro sophomore Jay Lee in the pole vault (13'6"), SFIS junior Christopher Tenorio in the long jump (20'5.5"), Cobre senior Derek Schuller in the shot put (51'6"), and East Mountain senior Tony Melof in the discus (136'1"). Robertson won the 4x100m relay (43.88), St. Michael's set a new state record in the 4x200m relay (1:31.33), Navajo Prep won the 4x800m relay (8:41.18), and St. Michael's won the 1600m sprint medley (3:44.96).

Girls

St. Michael's won their fourth straight state championship with a dominating performance. St. Michael's took top honors at the Class 3A 2024 NMAA State Track and Field Championships with 101 points. Santa Fe Prep was second with 61 points and Sandia Prep was third with 55 points. Jada Lujan of St. Michael's was the high point individual with 21 points and victories in the 100m hurdles



(17.59) and high jump (5'2").

Other winners include: Sandia Prep freshman Lexie Dixon in the 100m dash (12.62), Bosque senior Ariella Roghan-Press in the 200m dash and 400m dash (57.88), Sandia Prep junior Kate Henerson in the 800m run (2:17.26) and record setting time in the 1600m run (5:05.80), St. Michael's 8th grader Chloe Grieco with a state record in the 3200m run (11:03.48), Navajo Prep junior Lailah McGary in the 300m hurdles (47.74), St. Michael's sophomore Charlotte Herman in the pole vault (7'6"), Tucumcari senior Haisley Huffman in the long jump (17'4.25") and triple jump (35'11.75"), Santa Fe Prep senior Nicole Gonzales in the shot put (34'2.25"), Bosque senior Maya Kronberg in the discus, and St. Michael's freshman Nadia Cerdillo in the javelin (113'11"). Santa Fe Prep won the 4x100m relay (51.31), St. Michael's won the 4x200m relay (1:48.44), Sandia Prep set a new state record in the 4x400m relay (4:06.82), Cottonwood Classical won the 4x800m relay (10:39.26), and Santa Fe Indian School won the 1600m sprint medley (4:23.58).

Class 2A

Boys

The Hagerman Bobcats took home top honors at the Class 2A 2024 NMAA State Track and Field Championships. Hagerman finished first with 65 points, edging out second place Texico by four points. Eunice was third with 40. It's the third time in four years Hagerman won the blue trophy. Hagerman's Jevon Aguilar was the high point individual with 30.5 points and victories in the 100m dash (11.65), 200m dash (22.55), 400m dash (50.37), long jump (22'0.5"), and anchored their winning 4x400m relay (3:31.70).



Laguna Acoma sophomore Tagoya Pedro swept the distance races with wins in the 800m run (1:58.80), 1600m run (4:41.35), and 3200m run (10:11.08).

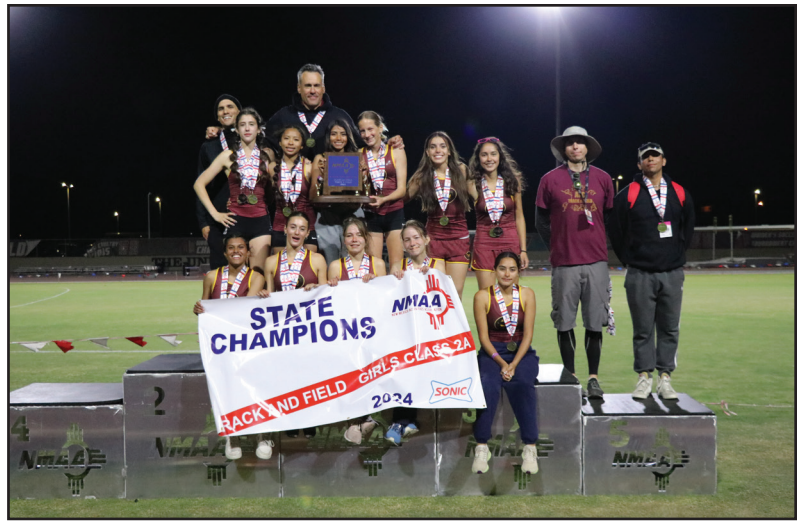
Other winners include: Dulce junior Jaren Johnson in the 110m hurdles, Texico sophomore Luke Thompson in the 300m hurdles (40.45), Eunice junior Luis Gomez in the high jump (6'), Clayton junior Bo Poling in the pole vault (11'), Estancia senior Josh Calhoon in the triple jump (41'9.75"), Texico junior Tye Smith in the shot put (48'), Santa Rosa senior Solomon Ross in the discus (142'3"), and Dulce senior James Johnson with a record throw in the javelin (183'10"). Texico won the 4x100m relay (44.55), Eunice won the 4x200m relay (1:34.35), Penasco won the 4x800m relay (9:00.43), and Pecos won the 1600m sprint medley (3:48.62).

Girls

For the second time in three years, Academy for Technology and the Classics finished first at the NMAA State Track and Field Championships. ATC won the 2024 Class 2A title with 58 points, ten points better than second place Menaul. Capitan was third with 39. ATC's Charli Koseoglu was the high point individual with 28 points and victories in the 100m dash (12.60), 200m dash (25.65), long jump (16'5.75"), and record setting mark in the javelin (137'9").

Other winners include: Menaul sophomore Emery Baker in the 400m dash (59.93), Rehoboth Christian senior Emily Garcia in the 800m run (2:24.44) and 1600m run (5:38.95), McCurdy freshman Marisol

Serna in the 3200m run (12:21.77), Escalante junior Ashley Gilmore in the 100m hurdles (17.20), Mora senior Mya Vigil in the 300m hurdles (48.89), Questa sophomore Alyse Lovato in the high jump (5') and triple jump (35'1.25"), Capitan junior Jada Serna in the pole vault (9'6"), Lordsburg senior Daphne Clark in the shot put (34'), Tularosa 8th grader Alivya Young in the discus (106'4") Loving won the 4x100m relay (52.17), Tatum took first in the 4x200m relay (1:51.99), Menaul won the 4x400m relay (4:17.99), McCurdy won the 4x800m relay (11:06.00), and Capitan won the 1600m sprint medley (4:36.38).



Class A

Boys

The Logan Longhorns make it back-to-back state titles. Logan won the Class A 2024 NMAA State Track and Field Championships with 100 points, edging out second place Melrose by two points. Legacy Academy was third with 40 points. Logan standout Haden Judd was the high point individual with 33 points and wins in the 100m dash (record time of 11.16), 200m dash, record time in the 300m hurdles (39.71), and record setting mark in the pole vault (14').



Other winners include: Logan sophomore Aydin Kotara in the 400m dash (51.42), Cimarron sophomore Logan Sahd in the 800m run (2:05.66), Oak Grove sophomore Joshua Marquez in the 1600m run (4:42.76) and record time in the 3200m run (10:07.62), Melrose senior Gray Brandon and a record time in the 110m hurdles (15.52), Melrose senior Michael Cardonita in the high jump (6') and record leap in the triple jump (42'11.25"), Floyd senior Isaias Nieto in the long jump (22'1.25"), Melrose senior Dathan Yearly in the shot put (49'1"), Fort Sumner Aaron Torres in the discus with a record throw (137'5"), and Logan senior Kaeden Stoner in the javelin (158'5"). Melrose set state records in the 4x100m relay (44.84) and 4x200m relay (1:33.42). Logan won the 4x400m relay (3:38.50), Oak Grove won the 4x800m relay (8:52.41), and Legacy Academy set a new state record in the 1600m sprint medley (3:53.38).

Girls

For the first time in the history of the program, Legacy Academy earned a blue trophy on the track. Legacy Academy won the Class A 2024 NMAA State Track and Field Championships with 74 points. Melrose was second with 46 and Ft. Sumner was third with 44. Taliyah Martinez from Legacy Academy was the high point individual with 23.5 points and victories in the 100m dash, 200m dash, 400m dash, and she anchored the record setting run in the 4x100m relay (51.45). Chesterton Academy senior Cecilia

Campos set new state records in the 800m run (2:25.14) and 1600m run (5:26.36).

Oak Grove 8th grader Olivia Marquez set a new state record in the 3200m run (11:33.97). Other winners include: Logan freshman Makinlee Judd with a record time in the 100m hurdles (16.35), Gateway Christian sophomore Alani Magill with a new state mark in the 300m hurdles (47.87), Roy junior Sylviana Baca in the high jump (4'10"), Melrose senior Heidi Macfarlane with a record tying mark in the pole vault (9'), Fort Sumner junior Allysya Casayd in the long jump (17'3") and javelin (110'4"), Des Moines 8th grader Katy Ward in the triple jump (31'11.75"), Mosquero junior Nora Crisp in the shot put (33'8"), and Carrizozo junior Bryana Villanueva in the discus (98'10"). Logan won the 4x200m relay (1:51.84), Gateway Christian set a new state record in the 4x40m relay (4:23.71), Melrose won the 4x800m relay (11:13.42), and Oak Grove finished first in the 1600m sprint medley (4:36.41).
